PASTOR'S POST: FINAL 5th Sunday of Easter Mother's Day -

May 14, 2017

Dear Shepherd of the Valley members and friends,

As I write this last Pastor's Post for the Shepherd's Voice my heart if full of gratitude for the time we had together these past 22 months. I absolutely cannot thank you all enough for the marvelous farewell we shared on

Sunday as we marked the conclusion of our time together. Thank you for your kind words and the wonderful cards, for the absolutely wonderful framed collection of Watanabe prints and the great accompanying book from the Brauer Museum of Art at Valparaiso University. I am so grateful for these remembrances to take with me and make part of my life wherever God may be leading me. Thank you!

To be honest, however, it is not without a sense of loss that I begin a new interim call at Trinity Lutheran Church in Sheridan, Oregon. I think a lot about processes of grief and loss and how people work through them, or don't. I think it is true that there is no major change that we experience that is also not at some level also an occasion for feelings of loss. Working through feelings of loss is a primary reason why it is important to have intentional processes of farewell and Godspeed such as we shared last Sunday.

Graduation is a good example of a kind of change that on the one hand is full of anticipation for the new, but also represents a time of loss. Two of my confirmands from Trinity in Salina, Kanas (2012-2014) graduate from high school this year, Samuel and Mikayla. A year from now their lives will be very different than they are today. Relationships with friends and family will change. Priorities will change. Adolescence is becoming adulthood for them.

Sometimes Mother's Day (also this Sunday) can be not only a time to celebrate all those who provide mothering nurturing love, but also can be hard for mothers whose children may have died, and those who would be mothers who were never blessed with children. As heartfelt as our greetings of "Happy Mother's Day" may be this Sunday, still there are some for which it is a time when the absence of a child or children may be felt all the more.

While this Sunday's Gospel (John 14:1-10) is full of assurance and hope grounded in God's love for us, it is also important to recognize that John 14 is part of Jesus's final discourse in the Gospel of John that begins in John 13 with the washing of the feet of the disciples, and concludes with their departure for the Garden of Gethsemane. This it is part of Jesus' address in the "upper room" to prepare his disciples for the difficult realities ahead: his betrayal, suffering, and death. Jesus knows that they will be shaken to the core by what they will experience. It is their hope and trust in God and in Christ Himself that will see them through. So Jesus says, "Let not your hearts be troubled. Believe in God; believe also in me. In my Father's house are many rooms...I go to prepare a place for you?"

While uncertain and change are always part of human life, ultimately the future is not uncertain. For we who believe and trust in Him He has prepared a place for each of us, that we may at last come to our true "home" in the household of God. This good news is at the heart of who and what we are wherever we are called to be church. The Lord bless and keep you all.

10:40 am- Meeting called to open - Bill Chambers

61 voting members on roster, 32 voting members in attendance

Opening Prayer - Pastor Joe Hughes

First Quarter Financial Update - Bill Chambers

The March 2017 monthly net income (actual contributions - actual expenses) was \$2145.98. The YTD net income (actual contributions - actual expenses) is \$626.53. The net income - less expenses for 2016 was \$-1015.04 and for 2017 is \$2145.98.

Call Committee Update - Peter Klammer

The committee completed the review of candidates. One candidate was viable, one accepted another call, one had family responsibilities and one was not a good fit. The committee decided to request additional candidate names from the District President. The one viable candidate will be considered again. A review process has been established so the process should go quicker. The goal is to have the candidates names to the committee in June.

Altar Refresh Update - Peter Klammer

The sanctuary was built in the 1960's. The refresh will make the altar area more appealing and larger. The steps will be removed and the altar, lectern, rails, floor, cross, windows and baptismal font will be new. The committee is looking for a woodworker to create the items. It was estimated to take up to six months and cost up to \$50,000.

Communion Assistant Proposal - Bill Chambers and Peter Klammer

Discussion on whether or not non-Elders should be able to help with communion. One person wanted to delay the vote but others wanted to be able to vote today. No motion was needed today as the Church Council had approved a proposal be voted on and requested it be by written vote and needing $\frac{2}{3}$'s majority to pass.

Proposal by the Board of Elders:

We propose to open the service of communion assistants to the non-Elder members of the congregation with the following qualification and conditions:

A. Lay assistants who assist the Pastor with communion at Shepherd of the Valley Lutheran Church shall:

- Be voting members in good standing as defined by bylaws.
- Be selected jointly by Pastor and Elders based on spiritual maturity, individual gifts and desire for service.
- Be supervised and trained by Pastor and Elders. Training to include:
 - Study of and agreement with the Lutheran understanding of the Sacrament of Holy Communion and the Liturgy of the Sacrament.
 - Procedural training in communion assistance practices.
 - Training references : Lutheran Catechisms, Lutheran Service Book and the resources available on LCMS.org (the synod website).

B. There will always be at least one Elder who assists with each communion service.

Private ballots provided for voting - Counted by Fernando Henriques and Jennifer Klammer 25 yes, 4 no, 3 abstain

The Elder's will create a process for being trained to assist with communion. Pastor Gene Ludwig will preach in May and we will be looking for a temporary Pastor.
