



Communion Assistant

Shepherd of the Valley is ready to expand the existing list of members that are trained to administer the sacrament to our fellowship of believers. This involves assisting the Pastor and an Elder during weekly communion service. The training will take about an hour.

Learn more about the last supper during Multi Gen bible study on June 25th with Pastor Doellinger to fully understand the importance of communion during our services.

An Elder will then walk the new communion assistants through the process of communion. All service communions will consist of the Pastor, an Elder, and a communion assistant.

With our new communion assistants involved in worship, the Elders will rotate duties 4 months out of the year, communion assistants will assist 8-9 Sundays a year.

From Your Call Committee

Thank you for continuing to support this important mission work with the Romanian orphans and atrisk children!




