

SVLC is selling their trusty John Deere riding lawn mower. Sale price is \$1500. This lawn tractor is in excellent condition



I have accepted the call to be the pastor for Shepherd of the Valley in Corvallis and I want to share with you how the Holy Spirit finalized my decision. I was in the chapel at Mt. Angel Abbey in prayer and meditation asking God to share with me his will and purpose with this call. During this time of prayer and meditation I had a feeling pressed on me to go read the scripture so I got up to get a bible from the library. As I was walking over to the library a voice within spoke to me and said, "read Philippians." As I went through the doors I first stopped in the periodical room, but I don't know why I did this as this isn't a usual thing for me. I picked up a journal on worship and read a great article about the Christ hymn in Philippians 2. Why did I pick up that journal? Was it God saying to me, "hey you, I told you to read Philippians and not an article!" or was it to reinforce his will? I am thick headed and am prone to wander and thankfully God is always working. After reading that article I opened the scripture to Philippians, read it, and the Holy Spirit used 1:1-12 to comfort and direct me.

Important to me are Paul's words, "Now I want you to know, brethren, that my circumstances have turned out for the greater progress of the gospel.." When I read that sentence I knew God wanted me to take the

call. Paul faced his circumstance knowing that it was to advance the gospel and your call to me is to advance the gospel. God is bringing us together to do something new for God's Kingdom. I have no idea what that is, but I am open and excited to share Jesus Christ with you and Corvallis! God is doing something new and I want you and I to be part of that.

Before I arrive I would like to share with you the deep reality present in God's gifts. In God's Word, forgiveness, baptism, and Lord's Supper we see God as loving and missional. He offers us grace as a free gift, welcomes us into his family, and secures us in his everlasting life and resurrection. This how God meets you. This is also one the churches greatest missional foundations. As God has loved us so we love others. Baptism and the Lord's Supper are central to a missional heart because it shows how God reaches us and how we can reach others- giving to restore, welcoming into a family, empowering to see life in the Kingdom of God. God's Word transforms by showing us who God is and his purpose for humanity and creation. Forgiveness is the powerful force that softens hearts and minds and we see life differently. In all these gifts the Holy Spirit is working, loving, enlightening, and calls to action as we share and live the gospel between each other and our neighbors. There is nothing our God cannot do, let us join him in the progress of the gospel of Jesus Christ. Amen!


