SHALOM!

Read Matthew 20:1-16 and then read these words by Valerius Herberger

This Gospel cannot be praised enough because of its kindness, for its extraordinarily comforting to repentant and humble hearts, who desire to be saved. This is the center: Let no one doubt; our salvation does not consist in our good works but only and merely on the fact that the heavenly Father is so kind. Our salvation is based simply on the mercy, grace, and kindness of the heavenly Father, which the Lord Jesus earned on the cross with His blood, sour work... But this text is also very frightening to all puffed up, proud spirits, whose hearts are swollen up in arrogance like an oven, and who build on their own holiness... In this Gospel there are three words that are the foundational pillars on which the whole building of this text rests: First, there is the "vineyard." Into the vineyard one must go and not stand idly in the worldly sin-market. Second, it speaks of the "work." This must be done, whether it is much or little. Idle grape-gorgers do not belong in the vineyard. Third, it mentions the loving heart of the heavenly Father, who is so kind ... Pay attention to these three pages and the entire Gospel will become light and clear for you, for the goal and purpose of the Gospel is not directed to who gets the coin (as some people have broken their heads on this question yet have only been made worse) but of who retains the grace of the Heavenly Father, who is so kind. -Valerius Herberger Peace.

Giving Garden End of Season Report October 31, 2018


The Giving Garden growing season ended with a huge total of 1366 pounds of produce donated mainly to Community Outreach, Inc. Some of the harvest went to St. Vincent de Paul and their mobile food bank at Garfield School. Nutritious fresh greens were constant throughout; lettuce, chard, kale, spinach and sorrel. This was the first year for our orchard harvest: apples, Asian pears, figs and plums. Volunteers loved to raid the strawberries, blueberries and blackberries. Summer harvest highlights included tomatoes, cucumbers, peppers, basil, melons and flowers. Pumpkins decorated doors and were handed out at Trunk or Treat Wednesday.

Thank you to each of the 64 volunteers throughout the 31 work sessions! Our home base SVLC volunteers included: Collen Fisher, Donna Durbin, Brad Boylan, Ray Hart, Pastor Eric, Char, Nora and Dietrich Bohlmann and Katy Schmidt. Thanks to Fernando Henriques, Jim Knoke and Lisa Boylan for hours and hours of support work. Fernando was keen to add more storage space and led the installation and settling of a new shed. The Homelife Team was new on the scene this year – Thanks to leaders Krista, Whitney and Sara and the reliable team: Heather Brittany, Kevin, Tyler and Dan! We always welcome community members and were happy to

have Meleah Ashford, Kathy Feser, Mary Gerrard, Peter Kenyon and Raina join in. We were blessed to have two youth service groups this year: Santiam High School Serve Day and a 4-H Summer Conference group. A SVLC-based Daisy Girl Scout Troop worked on a "Petal" (badge) in the garden as well.

The 4-H Garden Gnome Horticulture and Beekeeping Club was busy in the Giving Garden. They added a new purple beehive in the orchard. Everyone got to take home a jar of honey harvested and processed in July. Yummy! Their Giving Garden produce showed well at the Benton County and State 4-H fairs. One member got a medallion – the highest state award – for her beautiful strawberry entry!
