SHALOM!

The most basic identity of God is Trinitarian. It is out of *doing the will of another* that each individual person of the Trinity truly stands out. The Son of God did his Father's will by being born a human being and then experiencing death, that was a new experience for God, for your sake. Then the Father raised Jesus from the dead so you too may raise when Christ returns. Now the Father does Jesus' will by welcoming everyone who trusts in him into God's Kingdom. By doing the will of another each personal identity is reinforced and identity is experienced at the deepest level possible.

You were created in that image, that is, you will find yourself in relationship to another. Important here is baptism. In baptism you are united with Jesus and now you do his will with your life. This is non-other than setting your heart, your whole being, to doing his will and in doing so discover who you really are.

This idea of finding yourself in another is wonderful because it calls us beyond our ego and preference. It calls us to discover true identity so we may have life to its fullest and so our neighbor may discover it too. We had a wonderful discussion during last Sunday's bible study about how to engage worship so we can truly be present with God. I submit to you, unless our hearts seek an identity like that of the Trinity, and following Jesus' way, we won't be able to get to the most profound understanding of worship. We will be stuck on a surface level of preference and seeking new things. Those aren't bad things, but they are just surface things. We are meant to see life

deeper and from there those surface things can give expression to the deeper life. I hope you don't perceive this as a rebuke, but rather as an invitation to dive deep into a true and full life. Jesus tells us, "If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me." ²⁵For whoever would save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake will find it. ²⁶For what will it profit a man if he gains the whole world and forfeits his soul? Or what shall a man give in return for his soul?" (Matthew 16) Seek Jesus' identity so you may know yourself.

Below are two texts from the Gospel of Matthew and in both cases Jesus is concerned about the heart as it relates to worship. See what Jesus is really concerned about and meditate on that. To have truly good worship we need to always keep our hearts and our identity in Christ and at the center of our worship. With a right foundation we can continue to do worship in a way that honors how the habitual creates strong foundations and be open to fresh expressions so that both can keep Christ at the center of our worship for you and your neighbor.

Matthew 15:

⁷Hypocrites! Isaiah prophesied correctly about you when he said,

⁸"This people honors me with their lips, but their heart is far from me, ⁹and they worship me in vain, teaching as doctrines the commandments of men."

...

¹⁸But the things that come out of the mouth come from the heart, and these things defile a person.

Matthew 12

¹At that time Jesus went through the grain fields on the Sabbath, and His disciples became hungry and began to pick the heads of grain and eat. ²But when the Pharisees saw this, they said to Him, "Look, Your disciples do what is not lawful to do on a Sabbath." ³But He said to them, "Have you not read what David did when he became hungry, he and his companions, ⁴how he entered the house of God, and they ate the consecrated bread, which was not lawful for him to eat nor for those with him, but for the priests alone? ⁵Or have you not read in the Law, that on the Sabbath the priests in the temple break the Sabbath and are innocent? ⁶But I say to you that something greater than the temple is here. ⁷But if you had known what this means, 'I DESIRE COMPASSION, AND NOT A SACRIFICE,' you would not have condemned the innocent. ⁸For the Son of Man is Lord of the Sabbath."

⁹Departing from there, He went into their synagogue. ¹⁰And a man was there whose hand was withered. And they questioned Jesus, asking, "Is it lawful to heal on the Sabbath?"-so that they might accuse Him. ¹¹And He said to them, "What man is there among you who has a sheep, and if it falls into a pit on the Sabbath, will he not take hold of it and lift it out? ¹²How much more valuable then is a man than a sheep! So then, it is lawful to do good on the Sabbath." ¹³Then He *said to the man, "Stretch out your hand!" He stretched it out, and it was restored to normal, like the other. ¹⁴But the Pharisees went out and conspired against Him, as to how they might destroy Him.

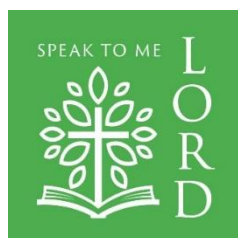

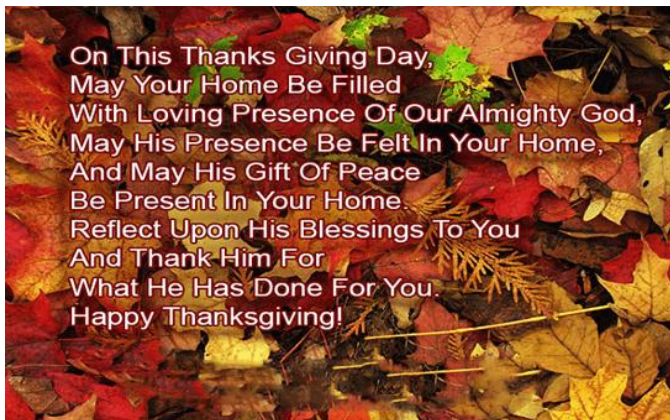
Advent Soup Suppers Wednesday, December 5th, 12th, and 19th at 6:00 p.m.

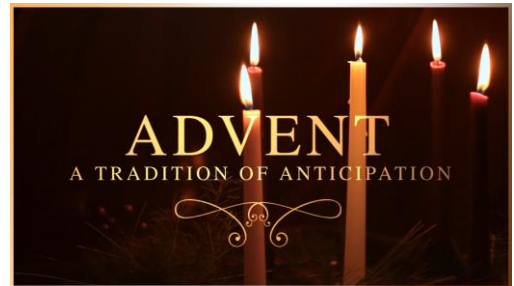


Light of Christ Anglican Church
