have mixed feelings about when old friends get together

and talk about the glory days. A college friend came down from Alaska a few weeks ago and a bunch of us friends got together at Washington Park in Portland. We all have kids, careers, and life is moving forward at ludicrous speeds. We had not seen each other in years so I understanding sharing the past to catch people up on where you are and maybe to even interject old college memories. Those old memories can be like salt in cooking, they heighten flavors. But what happened at Washington Park was not that. Sure, we did some debriefing where we are at in life. People talked about sports, kids, and some recent news. But there was also so much time spent on talking about the college days. Fun stories, embarrassing stories, people from those days, etc. When we were talking about those things it was like we were reliving and making the past more present than the present. Why? College was yesterday and today is different. It was like we were remembering each other and days long ago instead of seeking to be present as we watched our kids play while eating wasabi potato chips. By the way, wasabi potato chips are

amazing. There is something in me that just doesn't like talking about the past in such a way that makes the present seem secondary. We could have played a game, taken a hike, played tag, talked more about us guys flying up to Alaska for adventures and hunting, but for some reason we kept going back to college days.

Imagine if God didn't do a new thing in Jesus Christ. The old covenants would have been it. He would have been the new King David, but not the son of God. He would have restored the promised land, but not defeated the power of Satan and wouldn't be seated at the Fathers right hand and rule over all creation in a gracious and powerful way. If Jesus wasn't the new Adam then we wouldn't have the hope of a resurrection like we do. If God didn't do a new thing at Pentecost then we gentiles wouldn't have the relationship with God like we do. Memories are like salt, they enhance the flavor of cooking. Salt aids, but it's the main ingredients that matter the most. In fact, too much salt ruins good flavors and doctors tells us that too much salt is bad for us. I prefer to see life from the present moment, to focus on what we can do to live well presently. I want to focus on the present with each other and to seek the new things God is doing through the Holy

Spirit. God is so good and amazing I want to taste what He's cooking up for us.

As a church we live in the present and our sacramental faith is a great example of that. We talk about baptism and the Lord's Supper in such a way that they give us grace for the present. In baptism we are united with Christ's death, which is a way of making a key event in the life of Jesus mystically ours so we can live presently with the hope of a resurrection like his. It's not re-crucifying him each time we are baptized and it's not so we can hope to become infants in the faith again. It's a way of making the past present, but God did such a thing so our present life can be transformed. It's about a foundational identity for the present moment. The Lord's Supper is about Jesus Christ being present with us today, the table is set today. It unites us to Jesus so we may know today how God has made one in his mystical body. Its an activity done for today. We don't yearn for the last supper of Jesus and disciples because Jesus gives us a present supper far greater than that one in the past.

The bible is just as present moment focused as the sacraments. Yes, it does contain accounts of the past but it is also the Word of God and the Holy Spirit uses such past memories to enhance the present moment. How many times have you read God's Word and later that day or week God has given you a way to make sense of the present moment and or support someone else? In Act's Paul's mission to the Gentiles is a great example of living in the present reality God is giving. There were those who wanted to make everyone relive the past covenants, but God did a new thing through Jesus Christ and Paul made sure Peter and everyone remembered that.

To live in the present means to seek to be in the present. Brother David Steindl-Rast teaches a way to live presently and he uses the image of a stop sign. He teaches us to Stop, Look, and Go. Stop: tell yourself to stop and look up. Look: what is the unique opportunity before me/us? Go: avail yourself to the opportunity. Seek and taste the present things God is doing, don't live in the past. Be present and eat wasabi potato chips.

I first learned of Br. David Steindl-Rast from an episode of On Being with Krista Tippet and this teaching has stuck with me. Follow the link below if you are interested in knowing more about him.

THRIVENT NEWS ~ JUNE 2019

The Thrivent Annual Meeting was held on May 11, 2019, during which 2018 activities were reviewed, 2019 activity ideas were discussed, and allocations of Thrivent Choice Dollars (designated in 2018) were specified. In 2018 Thrivent members and friends at SVLC were busy with numerous projects. Once again, dozens upon dozens of Hygiene Kits were presented to Community Outreach, Inc. to bless those who use the shelter facilities for personal care and temporary residence. Donna Durbin coordinated the collection, organization, and distribution of kits with the help of \$500 in 2018 Thrivent Choice Dollars.

Worship activities were enhanced with the purchase of a high-definition monitor/screen mounted to the left of the altar, assisted by \$750 in Thrivent Choice Dollars. We thank Jeff Hintzman for spearheading this purchase. The Giving Garden was beneficiary of Thrivent Choice Dollars (\$40) for wood chips and (\$300) the new storage shed. Fernando Henriques oversaw these purchases. (A special note: As Fernando researched the purchase of wood chips, he discovered that Buena Vista Arbor Care is happy to donate and deliver chips to non-profits. Fernando arranged for a delivery in 2018 and again in 2019.)

We continue to support homeless students and their families at Linus Pauling Middle School by providing Fred Meyer gifts cards (10 \$20 cards) to our contact, Viviana Gonzalez. Viviana carefully and lovingly distributes these cards to families in need of various help (food, gas, shoes, pharmacy purchase, etc.) The grand total of Thrivent Choice Dollars used in 2018 was \$1790.00.

Additionally, three Thrivent Action Teams were at work in 2018. In spring, Fernando applied for the \$250 Thrivent grant to support the purchase of materials to paint the new Giving Garden shed and to build storage shelves. Katy received the \$250 grant to help support the purchase of back packs for the Homeless Student Backpack and School Supplies project. SVLC members and friends were generous to contribute numerous supplies that were placed in the packs that were then delivered to Linus Pauling Middle School for distribution. The third Thrivent Action Team grant was received to support Trunk 'r Treat, held October 31st, blessing kids and families with a safe place to celebrate All Hallows Eve and garnering food supplies to donate to Community Outreach.

Thrivent members are already busy in 2019, with Char Bohlmann receiving a Thrivent Action Team grant of \$250 to help support the Block Party, to be held June 8th to bless those who use the SVLC facilities for various ministries and to receive donations of food supplies for Benton Food Share. Katy will again apply for a grant to support the annual Homeless Student Backpack project to be held later this summer.

At the May 11th meeting, Thrivent members voted on the following allocations for 2019: 1) Hygiene Kits for Community Outreach, Inc. - \$500 (project lead Donna); 2) Giving Garden Valves and Timers Replacement - \$300 (project lead Fernando); 3) New Landscape Around Church Sign - \$400 (project lead Fernando); 4) Linus Pauling Homeless Student Support - \$200 (project lead Katy); 5) Three Wood Floor Push Brooms - \$100 (project lead Lisa Boylan); and 6) Upright Vacuum Cleaner -\$165 (lead Lisa). The grand total for 2019 allocations is \$1665.00.

Our abiding desire is for Thrivent members to take advantage of the \$250 in seed money that comes with each Thrivent Action Team Grant. Thrivent members are able to receive two TAC grants per year. That represents thousands of dollars in seed money among our many SVLC Thrivent members.

If you would like to learn how to apply for Thrivent Action Team grants, please see Katy Trautman who will help you through the process. Seed money can be used to support a fund-raiser or to underwrite materials used in a hands-on project. Put your creativity to work and design an activity that supports your personal ministry and passion!
